Composition

Write sentences by:

say out loud what they are going to write about

compose a sentence orally before writing it

sequence sentences to form short narratives

re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense

Discuss what they have written with the teacher or other pupils

Read writing aloud clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher.

Punctuation

Understand and use full stops accurately


Add question marks to questions.

Add exclamation marks to sentences.

Use capitalisation letters for the personal pronoun "I", for names and for the first word in a sentence.

Understand other common uses of capitalisation e.g. for personal titles (Mr, Miss), headings, book titles, emphasis.

Read aloud with pace and expression appropriate to the grammar, e.g. pausing at full stops, raising voice for questions.
