- using description to create atmosphere for the reader
- editing, uplevelling and writing with stamina

Our outcomes at the end of the half term will be to write our own five-part narrative with description of setting and character, creating atmosphere and creating a balanced argument discussing: should children be evacuated?

Maths

We will be refreshing our knowledge of fractions, looking at: equivalent fractions; simplifying fractions; adding and subtracting with common denominators. Then we will apply our knowledge to a mix of integers and decimal numbers.


Fractions, Decimals and Percentages

- Multiplying and dividing decimals by integers including in context.


Science

Humanities

In history, we will be looking at how Women's Rights have changed over time. We will:

- describe how women's rights have changed over time
- explain who the suffragettes were, name key individuals and explain their impact
- explain how and why women's rights changed after WW2
- evaluate gender equality within modern day society

Design and Technology

- explore WW2 recipes and apply the principles of a healthy and varied diet
- investigate recipes with focus on seasonality and ingredients that could be reared, grown, processed in the locality
- use ingredients and equipment to prepare Savory dishes using a range of cooking techniques
- evaluate products and understand how they were shaped by the key event of rationing in WW2
