English

This term, in English we will be using the text 'Where the Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak to develop our writing skills. Our topic focus is narrative and characters. We will explore the characters in each story as we go and use our knowledge from what we have read to help up describe them. Our outcome at the end of the half term will be to write a character description.

We will continue to work on using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops to punctuate our sentences correctly. We will build on our knowledge of nouns, verbs and adjectives by describing the characters from the text.

Science

We will continue our topic 'Seasonal Changes' this half term. In this unit we will:

- observe changes across the four seasons
- observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
- talk about changes in the weather and the seasons.
- work scientifically by: making tables and charts about the weather

Art

This half term we will focus on Art. Our topic will be 'Let's Paint!'

We will be exploring the work and life of Wassily Kandinsky.

We will look at the use of colour in his work and we will explore primary colours. We will mix primary colours to make secondary colours.

Topic I – Meals. During this topic we will learn about The Last Supper and how it was a very special meal. We will think about special meals we have shared with others and why they were important.



Addition and subtraction to 20

This half term we will work on addition and subtraction to 20. We will explore number bonds to 20 and doubles. We will use physical resources to help us work out addition and subtraction calculations before using known strategies using the correct vocabulary to explain our work.

We will use different representations to help us gain a deeper understanding and begin reasoning around what we know.
