# Key Question: What lives under the ground?

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- To talk about their own personal experiences.
- To engage in/initiate more complex and extended turn taking games.
- To offer ideas and strategies for how to work together.
- To articulate reasons for success or failure in a challenge.
- To understand the impact of own actions and how they affect others.
- To read facial expressions/body language and extend the vocabulary of emotions.

### Communication and Language

- Circle time Listening to and responding to others.
- Innovate known stories and retell in own words using the children's own drawings
- Memorise rhymes and incorporate body percussion or instrumental sounds as a simple performance.
- To listen carefully for a sustained period of time.
- To listen and respond to ideas expressed by others in conversation/discussion.
- To ask who, what, when and how questions.
- Recall, use and define key vocabulary.

# Physical Development

- NUF Fundamental Movements
- Continue to develop gross motor practice outdoors, crawling, balancing, throwing, catching, jumping, kicking a large ball, and using a bat and ball.
- Enjoying playing team games together.
- Listening to instructions and following rules during outdoor play.
- Moving in different ways responding to music.
- To discuss the effects of physical exercise on their bodies.
- Fine motor challenges each week.
- Continue to develop good pencil hold/control.
- Continue to develop skills using scissors.
- Learn how to use tools effectively to plant and care for plants.

#### Mathematics

- To count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system.
- Beginning to count in 2s and IOs.
- Regularly use images/ videos of number blocks to support learning.
- Learn and use the language of 'more than', 'less than' and 'equal to' to describe the relationships between numbers.
- Investigate part-part-whole relations, e.g., seeing that 7 can be made of 5 + 2.
- Explore doubling quantities to IO.
- Practically explore even and odd numbers.
- To know and recall number bonds to 5 and to 10.
- Continue and create more complex linear patterns.

### Expressive Arts and Design

- Observational drawings.
- To make their own minibeasts models.
- To explore different materials and effects.
- Representative/imaginative play in small world and home corner.
- Sing Up Slap, Clap, Clap / It's Oh So Quiet
- To use musical instruments and dance/movement to reflect the ways in which different minibeasts travel around.
- To compose their own music using the coloured bells.
- To learn new songs related to our theme.

### Literacy

- To continue to learn new sounds/tricky words.
- Read texts that match sounds and words learnt in phonics (fully decodable).
- Read words, captions and simple sentences.
- Sequence familiar stories.
- Take part in weekly Reading Practice sessions.
- Read non- fiction books about minibeasts/lifecycles.
- Daily Drawing Club lessons
- Continue to use rhymes to assist the correct letter formation.
- Write simple captions and sentences
- To use writing in all areas writing words, lists, and signs.
- To form lowercase and capital letters correctly.

# Key Vocabulary

- Minibeasts, insects, creatures, bugs, slugs, worms, beetles, ladybirds, caterpillars, butterflies, cocoon, chrysalis, pupa, emerges, growth, observe, life cycle, change.
- King, Queen, throne, reign, rule, palace
- Addition, adding, altogether, plus, greater than, subtraction, takeaway, fewer, less than, double, part, equals, odd and even.
- Design, pattern, repeat, same, different.

### Understanding the World

- Seasons Discuss and record changes.
- Sequence growth over time.
- Find out about lifecycles.
- Plant seeds and plants.
- To learn about minibeasts and their habitats.
- To explore the outdoor area and look for signs of minibeasts.
- To record their findings.
- To find out about Queen Elizabeth. Look at pictures of the past and find out a little about her life.
- To discuss keeping healthy and fit and the importance of having a healthy diet.
- To discuss the importance of looking after our teeth.
