- Count in fractions up to a whole

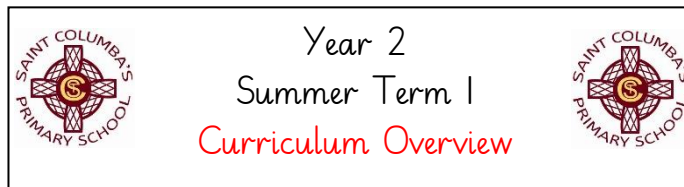
Time

Science

Our Science topic over this half term is 'Plants.'

- All plants need light from the sun and water to grow
- Plants make their own food in their leaves using sunlight.
- The inside of a plant has a seed store, a baby plant and seed coat.
- Germination is when the seed soaks up water and swell, and the tiny new plant bursts out of its shell.
- Seed dispersal is when the seeds move away from the parent plant.



Design and Technology

Our topic this half term is: 'Let's Sew Puppets'.

- know how to move a variety of finger, hand and string puppets.
- that a running stitch is made by passing the needle in and out repeatedly with short, even stitches.
- keeping a long tail on the tread helps it stay through the eye of the needle.
- pulling thread taut helps keep it from tangling.
- that fabric glue will stick decorations to felt.
